



ERASMUS + "HANDS IN HANDS" PROJECT QUESTIONNAIRE EVALUATION

The questions were asked in October 2017, in the Public Primary School No 14 in Radom. 60 people took part in the survey, including 10 teachers, 20 parents and 20 students.

The survey was conducted after the first year of implementing the Erasmus+ "Hands in Hands" project in our school. The people taking part in the survey were either the ones closely connected to the project who work in it, or individuals acquainted to the project's assumptions but not closely connected to the project.

There were seven closed-ended questions to answer. Each questions could be answered in three different ways (yes, no, no opinion). The survey participants answered to all 7 questions.

On the basis of the answers collected it's easy to find that the project successfully addressed the planned target group and its reception is positive.

From all 420 answers given, 368 were positive (YES), 17 were negative (NO) and 35 were neutral (NO OPINION). The teachers gave mostly positive answers (131), the students gave the smallest number of positive answers (114) with the parents giving 114 positive answers.




Diagram1. Total results comparison




Diagram2. Q 1. Has the project brought change into your school life and educational offer of your school?

Chart 3.Q 2. Is the project offer attractive to the participants?




Diagram 3.Q 2. Is the project offer attractive to the participants?

Chart 4. Q 3. Has participating in the project increased your motivation to improve language skills among the participants?





Diagram 4. Q 3. Has participating in the project increased your motivation to improve language skills among the participants?

Q4 was one of more difficult questions in the questionnaire for the students. That's why only 13 positive answers were given, with 5 negative and 2 neutral. The parents gave 14 positive and 6 neutral answers. The biggest number of positive answers was among the teachers – 19 positive answers with one negative.

Chart 6. Q 5. Has participating in the project broadened international contact among its participants?




Diagram 6. Q 5. Has participating in the project broadened international contact among its participants?

Question 6. Do you consider participating in the project interesting and developing social competences (e.g. co-operation, socialization, solidarity, understanding cultural differences, physical incapacities etc.) and communicative competences (body talk, reading your facial expressions and gestures etc.)?

This question covered the widest range of the project's goals. 55 answers given were positive – 20 parents, 19 teachers and 16 students. Only one answer was negative.



Chart 8. Q 7. Considering the experience gained, will the participants agree to take part similar projects in the future?




Diagram 8. Q 7. Considering the experience gained, will the participants agree to take part similar projects in the future?
